
## SnagIt Directions for Dr. Palmer's Class


Dr. Palmer would like you to make a video presentation consisting of an introduction with you on screen, followed by a PowerPoint presentation. You can do all of this easily using Snaglt and a webcam. You will need to use the Green Room in the Library's Digital Media Center—this room has a computer with the most current version of Snaglt and a nice webcam and microphone. To use this room, stop at the Reference Desk to ask to be let into the room.

You should have your PowerPoint presentation finished and up on the screen before starting the Snaglt part.



Next you will click on the red Capture button and then draw your region to encompass your PowerPoint presentation.

Once you start recording, you will be able to toggle between having the webcam on or off. In the next screenshot, notice the icon that has a person in a screen—that is where you toggle the webcam on or off.



You may need to try this a couple of times before you are satisfied with your results. This is normal and part of the process of making an excellent video.
